

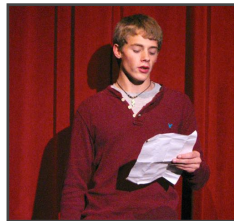
Welcome to Orlando Repertory Theatre's Sensory-Friendly Performance of

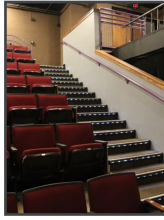
I know that the show is starting because a person on the stage talks to the audience.



There is music, sounds, and colors in the show. If something is too loud, I can cover my ears, put on my headphones, or hold a friend or family member's hand. I can cover my eyes if something is too bright.



The actors might invite me to participate in a beach ball toss. I can participate if I want or I can just watch and listen. The actors may be close to me or in an aisle near my seat. I do not have to talk to them if I do not want to.



If I need to take a break from the show, I tell a friend or family member.
We exit the theatre and go to the quiet room or restroom.



I know the show is over when the actors take a bow. I can show that I liked the show by clapping my hands.
Other people may clap too, and it may be loud. If the clapping is loud, it is okay to cover my ears.



After the show, the actors will be in the lobby. They will wear their costumes from the show.
If I want, I can say hello to them.



When it is time to leave, I will wait for my friends and family before I go outside of the building.
